Mailboxes

Please make sure your mailbox is attached securely to the post so the snow mounds or snow from the plow do not dislodge it. The Village will only repair or replace mailboxes/posts that have visual damage from our plow trucks. According to USPS regulations the face of the mailbox must be between six to nine inches back from the edge of the pavement or curb. The height from the ground to the bottom of the mailbox must be between 41-43 inches.

Any person owning, possessing, harboring or having the care, charge, control or custody of any dog or domestic animal shall immediately remove and thereafter dispose of any fecal matter deposited by said dog on public or private property without the consent of the owner or person in lawful possession of said property.
