I wanted to share some information on Lake County Municipality Tax Revenue, while it varies from town to town, a significant segment of Municipality Tax Revenue typically comes from property taxes. Municipality Tax Revenue is the tax income allocated for local governments. When reviewing the Municipality Tax Revenue for the Village of Round Lake Heights, the Village takes very little municipality tax revenue from residents property taxes. The exact figure for 2017 is 141,929.02. I am happy to say that we are the 4th lowest out of 45 municipalities. The Village is also the 8th lowest for overall tax rate. The Village has always taken the lowest possible Municipality Tax Revenue increase for the past 25 years. Since my term of being Mayor along with the Board of Trustees this is a huge accomplishment I am very proud of!

Code Enforcement

Village code 4-4-4 maintenance requirements-grass cutting. Grass and other vegetative growth shall not exceed eight inches (8") in height; the owner or occupant shall cut or caused to be cut to a height of less than eight inches (8").

Telephone Scams

[Telephone scammers](#) try to trick you out of money or get access to your personal information. Scams may come through phone calls from real people, robocalls, or text messages. The callers often make false promises, such as opportunities to buy products, invest your money, or receive free product trials. They may also offer you money through free grants and lotteries. Some scammers may call with threats of jail or lawsuits if you don't pay them.

Reporting scams to federal agencies helps them collect evidence for lawsuits against people committing these scams. However, federal agencies don't investigate individual cases of telephone scams.
