I am asking residents if you have received a survey from NIU, please fill it out and return it. This was a survey that was sent to some residents regarding the consolidation of shared services for the Round Lake communities from the University.

I also want to mention that one of the pumps in the Chesapeake Trail lift stations burned out in the beginning of October. This appeared to be flushable wipes that were put into the system. This is a friendly reminder not to flush any items of this sort even if the packaging says "flushable" on their packaging.
