Have Unwanted Prescriptions? Bring Them To A Collection Box

If you opened your medicine cabinet today, would you find expired medications inside? Do you know how to dispose them? You can drop off unwanted prescription drugs at one of several collection boxes located in 27 police department lobbies across Lake County. Soon, you may be able to dispose of prescriptions at your local Walgreens too. The company recently announced they will install medication disposal kiosks in Illinois and 38 other states. This expansion helps build on efforts among local partners including government, health, and law enforcement, to fight prescription drug abuse, and help curb misuse of medications and the rise in overdose deaths

GROOT YARD WASTE PICK UP

Yard Waste Pickup will begin on Friday, April 1, 2016 and run through November 25, 2016. All yard waste must be bagged in a brown paper lawn bag and have a sticker on it or Groot will not pick it up.

Stickers are available at the Village Hall for \$2.25 each.

Pick-up is on Friday mornings and such containers shall be placed on the parkway adjoining such premises within ten (10) hours before garbage pickup and shall be removed there from within ten (10) hours after the pickup service is rendered.

Please do not rake leaves to the side of the road as leaf pick up is in the fall. All leaves that you need picked up earlier are to be bagged and tagged with yard waste stickers.

Who is eligible to receive a scholarship?

ANY resident of Round Lake Heights that is planning to attend college or is already enrolled in college.

Are the scholarships only for "high school" students?

NO, the scholarships are also available for adults who would like to continue their education.

Are the scholarships based on your household income?

NO, everyone is eligible to receive a scholarship regardless of your household income.

How much money will I receive?

The scholarships are based on the amount of money we have raised throughout the year, and the number of applications we receive but the past average has been \$500-\$750.

What are the requirements after you receive a scholarship?

We ask that you volunteer your time at one of the many functions the Village holds throughout the year.
