Ensure your safety by checking the batteries on your carbon monoxide detector and buying an updated one if you need to.

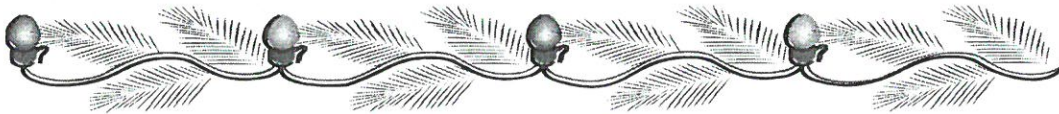
The most important tip to keep in mind during the colder months is to ask for help.

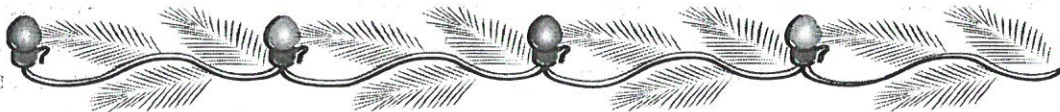
HOLIDAY LIGHT RECYCLING
